II. Constitutional Resolution

“That, pertaining to Article IV, Section 5 of the Class Constitution, provided that the Constitution be affirmed during the 2000-2001 school year, persons serving as both SGO Officer and Class Officer concurrently shall not be required to resign one of their positions, and shall be allowed to continue to serve in both positions during that school year.”

III. Amendments to the SGO Constitution

Many of the reforms which we put in the Class Constitutions will be offered as amendments to the SGO Constitutions as well. The text of most of these amendments is directly copied word-for-word from the Class Constitution. As such, we will not be discussing these amendments extensively.

- *Amendment II: Voting Reform.* This is a collection of many of the stipulations pertaining to elections and voting.
- *Amendment III: Veto Reform.* This changes the wording of the Administration’s power of veto to mirror that in the Class Constitution.
- *Amendment IV: S.G.O. Representatives.* This overhauls the process for selecting S.G.O. Representatives.
- *Amendment V: Ineligible Officer.* This copies a clause from the Class Constitution, that Officers who are found to be failing a course during their term are suspended from their duties. (Currently, an SGO Officer must not be failing any course in order to run.)
- *Amendment VI: Nondiscrimination.* This is from the Class Constitution.
